Current Background Checks

The Program with Minors policies of the Texas AGM University System now requires all third-party camps/programs to have verification of a background check within the last 12 months in addition to current Youth Protection Training.

The Texas Trails Council is able to secure background checks for all Leaders registered within the Council. All out of council Leaders will either have to provide a current background check from his or her Council or verification of a current background check will be requested by the Texas Trails Council.

Registration deadlines are firm in order to secure background checks in a timely manner. No late registrations will be allowed, and Leaders are only able to attend with verification of YPT and a current background check prior to the start of the event.

Dear Scoutmaster:

Your unit is invited to attend the Tarleton State University Merit Badge Seminar, hosted by TSU and sponsored by the Texas Trails Council, Boy Scouts of America. This will be a unique opportunity for your Scouts to work on many different merit badges! This event has been hosted at Tarleton State for over 35 years!

Time & Place: The Merit Badge Seminar will be conducted on the TSU campus on Saturday, February 15 and Sunday, February 16. Lock-in sleeping facilities are available on Friday, February 14 and Saturday, February 15 (please see attached camping information sheet). Outdoor camping is also available on the TSU Recreational Fields for both nights. A schedule of events for the weekend is included in this packet.

Cost: The Scout fee for the Merit Badge Seminar is \$60.00 (three-meal package of lunch and dinner Saturday and lunch on Sunday) or \$82.00 (five-meal package which includes the listed meals plus breakfast in the dining hall both mornings). Other fees may apply for certain merit badges to cover materials (see registration form). This fee also covers an event patch, supplies, and facility rentals. Adult fees may vary (see registration form). Additional fees are for the Blended Wilderness First Aid Course (see insert).

REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS February 8th (There will be no refunds after this date.) PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED. FEES MUST BE PAID IN FULL AT THE COUNCIL OFFICE BEFORE REGISTRATION WILL BE

ENTERED. Classes will be filled on a first-come, first-paid basis—so register as soon as possible! LATE REGISTRATIONS AND WALK-INS FOR SCOUTS ONLY will be accepted for a \$60 per Scout (plus \$18 for additional breakfasts), but not all classes may be available. LATE ADULT LEADER WALK-INS ARE NOT PERMITTED DUE TO TEXAS A&M SYSTEM RISK MANAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS.

Merit Badges: A Scout may work on up to three (3) different merit badges from a list of approximately 75 merit badges offered. We have several sessions for some of the required Eagle merit badges to keep the classes smaller. All classes meet for three hours each on Saturday and Sunday with periodic breaks.

Leadership: Each Troop must have at least TWO (2) REGISTERED ADULTS, one of whom must be over 21 years of age. All leaders are required to have current BSA Youth Protection Training to be on campus with your troop at all times and supervising your troop while traveling and camping.

Adult: Onsite training will be available. A computer lab will be available for all adult on-line training.

Uniform: All Scouts and leaders must wear their full Class A uniform for classes, meals, and chapel. A Scout-related t-shirt is adequate for off-times and activities.

Event Information

Step 1. Review this packet in total. All merit badges will be taught by the following schedule:

Class A—Saturday at 9:00 am – 12:00 noon

Class B—Saturday at 1:30 pm – 4:30 pm

Class C—Sunday at 9:00 am – 12:00 noon

When registering, please list the merit badge class choices in order of priority, 1st choice being the most needed or desired, and 6th to 8th choices the least needed or preferred.

Step 2. Leaders must review merit badge requirements to determine if a Scout is mature enough to register for the class. Consider the needs of the Scout and the work, some of which may be necessary before class.

Step 3. Scouts will be registered for up to 3 merit badges. Most merit badge classes take 3 hours of total class time. Search and Rescue and Plant Science take two class sessions. This totals six hours of class time.

Step 4. Have the Scouts study the merit badge pamphlets prior to attending the Seminar. Some work will need to be completed before or after class and/or may have “time requirements”. We will provide worksheets for the classes. It is recommended Scouts bring a notebook or folder for notes and class materials.

Step 5. Register the Scouts and adults who are attending and submit registration form(s) and fee payment by mail or online to the Texas Trails Council

Step 6. The Merit Badge Seminar Staff will assign classes to all scouts and will try to register each scout with his or her first choice in each time slot. Due to the number of merit badges we must schedule, and in trying to keep class size reasonable, some flexibility is expected. We do our best. Class assignments will be emailed to your **designated Troop Leader by February 12th, 2026. BE SURE THE EMAIL ADDRESS IS CORRECT FOR THE MAIN CONTACT PERSON.**

Step 7. Individual class lists and maps will be included in your registration packet to be picked up by a leader during check-in. We will do check-in on Friday night so that leaders will have materials to review and distribute to Scouts and Leaders.

Step 8. Attend the Merit Badge Seminar. The instructor for each session will have a roster to check attendance and requirement completion. After the event, the troop contact person will receive a list of Scouts and badges earned/requirements completed. The Merit Badge Seminar Staff retains the attendance sheet by classes.
NOTE: Remember, simply attending class does not guarantee a Scout will complete the Merit Badge.

Step 9. Review partials and completions received after the event and help your Scouts complete any remaining requirements. Recognize your Scouts for their achievements! Completion reports will be sent to each troop within 4 weeks after the MBS.

MEALS..... WHAT'S FOR LUNCH?

Food will be provided in the Tarleton Dining Hall for lunch and dinner on Saturday, and lunch on Sunday, as well as breakfast for those who purchase additional meals with registration.

Dining cards will be included in your registration packet to be picked up by leader upon arrival. Cards must be returned by lunch on Sunday. **Lost or missing cards will result in a \$10 charge per card to your troop account.** Be sure to have an adult or troop/patrol leader coordinate the use of the cards.

BSA Blended Wilderness First Aid Course

We're offering a blended Wilderness First Aid course at the TSU Merit Badge Seminar this year. "Blended" means it is partially online and partially "live."

Wilderness First Aid (WFA) training is focused on preventing, assessing, and treating illnesses or injuries in remote environments where prompt access to professional care is limited (typically an hour or more away).

Tailored for remote high adventures, the importance of WFA lies in its ability to prepare individuals to identify and manage medical issues in backcountry settings. The Boy Scouts of America has developed a specialized curriculum to train Scouts and Scouters in providing assessment and treatment far from advanced care. These skills, crucial for treating injuries, also emphasize early recognition of illnesses to prevent harm. Importantly, WFA knowledge extends beyond the backcountry and proves valuable in urban areas during disasters, such as hurricanes or mass casualty events, where emergency services may be strained.

All four of the BSA high-adventure bases (HAB) require at least one person per trek (three per trek at Philmont Scout Ranch) to be current in WFA through one of the BSA's approved providers. Of course, having more participants trained in WFA skills is highly recommended for any high adventure or backcountry experience. Scouters and youth (who are at least 14 years of age) may satisfy the WFA requirements.

Normal BSA Wilderness First Aid courses consist of 16 hours of live instruction. The ECSI blended course consists of 8 hours of online instruction and 8 hours of live instruction/skills tested by a certified ECSI Instructor.

Benefits to the blended course:

- the flexibility of online learning (**at times of your own choosing**)
- only **one day of live instruction** (while your Scouts attend the TSU Merit Badge College)
- a price break — **students pay for the online portion at a discount, and the live instruction has a fee of \$75. Total cost will be around \$100, as opposed to the normal cost of \$150 for the fully-live course.**

The online portion of the course can be taken at your own pace, and is designed to last 8 hours. It includes chapter quizzes and a final test that must be successfully completed. Once you have successfully finished the course work and exam, you will be able to print your course completion certificate. The next step is to complete the eight hour in-person skills check. **After successful completion of the skills check course, you will have earned your WFA certification, which is good for two years.**

Be sure to sign up early!!

Once you sign up, you'll receive an email with the discount code and instructions for enrollment in the online portion of the class.

Leave yourself time to complete the online section. It is designed to take approximately 8 hours total class time.

You must complete the online portion before taking the in-person section!



Note: CPR/AED certification is a prerequisite for the WFA certification. Plans are for CPR/AED certification to be offered at the TSU Merit Badge College for an additional \$20 fee.

TROOP LOCK-IN/CAMPING INFORMATION SHEET**

We are offering ‘Lock-In’ sleeping at the **Stephenville City Recreation Center at 378 W. Long Street**. The facility is limited to 80-100 Scouts and Leaders, so reservations will be taken on a first-come, first-serve basis. Scouts must be supervised at all times, and the facilities will need to be cleaned prior to departure on Sunday morning. The facilities are available on Friday evening, February 20 and Saturday evening February 21. Doors will open at 7:00 pm and will close at 11:00 pm. **To help protect the floor of the center, only sleeping pads and bags are allowed on the floor and cots on the stage. Also, when troops leave for campus on Saturday morning, all gear must be moved to the stage to facilitate activities in the center during the day. All gear must be removed on Sunday morning before going to campus. Be sure not to leave valuables.** The Seminar staff, the City of Stephenville, and TSU are not responsible for lost or stolen items, so it is suggested expensive or electronic items stay in a locked vehicle or not brought at all.

Tent Camping is available at a different location this year!! The exact location will be posted shortly. When you arrive on campus. Merit Badge Seminar staff will assist you with locating available camping areas. No fires or cooking will be allowed at the camping site. Portable restrooms will be provided.

Youth protection guidelines will be followed at all times during these activities. **Remember – 2-deep leadership is required at all times!**

Troop leadership is responsible for the behavior of their Scouts at all times on campus.

Troops wishing to camp or use the lock-in facility must fill out the reservation form below and return it with your Troop registration for the Merit Badge Seminar. There is no extra cost for either, however, you do need to reserve your spot.
